MEMBERSHIP REGISTRATION FORM

SCNN in Brief:

Street Children NGOs Network (SCNN) based in Kampala district in Uganda, is a non-profit making civil society organisation.

It exists to; promote Networking of NGOs, Government and Communities to jointly address the problem of children living on streets in Uganda through Capacity building, lobbying, advocacy and research.

Membership:

SCNN membership is open to all registered civil society organizations, and individuals or community groups working or interested in contributing to alleviation of street children problem in Uganda.

Categories of Membership:

1. Full members:

Are nongovernmental organizations, CBOs (Community Based Organizations) and Faith Based Organisations (FBOs) directly or indirectly working to contribute to addressing street children problem in Uganda.

Eligibility for full membership:

- Any legal organization either local or international that is interested in and committed to the implementation of goals of SCNN.
- Membership shall be attained by application, approval and payment of a membership fee determined by the board of directors.
- Organizations, referred to as MEMBERS, shall be represented by persons of sound mind and understanding of the problem of street children.
- Applications for membership shall be obtained from SCNN secretariat or on line.
Fee is 50,000 Uganda Shillings for local NGOs, CBOs and FBOs annually.
International NGOs fee is 200 Dollars annually.

2. Associate Members:

Associate membership is open to any registered organization or individuals who by interest may wish to join SCNN locally or internationally.

No person or organization shall attain the aforementioned membership unless:

- That member has shown reasonable interests, participation and willingness to pursuing the aims and objectives of SCNN.
- That member or group to have paid up membership fee.

Fee for international organizations or cooperate bodies is 500 US Dollars annually.

Entitlements

- A copy of SCNN Newsletter quarterly (4 times a year)
- Access to SCNN Resource room and use of materials such as; a computer with internet connections for a specified period of time in a day, access any available resource material (hard or soft copies) regarding children issues in Uganda.
- Partnering with SCNN to source grants for implementing joint projects related to children issues (specifically to member NGOs only).
- SCNN annual technical and Finance reports.
- Participating in any training workshop organized by SCNN for the purposes of improving capacity to implement programs that are geared to addressing street children problem in Uganda.
- Benefit from an established referral system to help in emergencies regarding children in need of immediate help. This is done through a network of committed civil society organizations, communities and government sectors providing direct services to children.
- Directly benefit from having a collective amplified voice in advocating for the rights of children in Uganda as well as influencing policies at all levels.
